

THE TEMPTATIONS REVIEW FEATURING DENNIS EDWARDS LEGACY

For nearly three decades, The Temptations Review Featuring Dennis Edwards has thrilled audiences around the world with the timeless Motown sound. Dennis Edwards, the legendary former lead singer of The Temptations, first joined the group in 1968, following the departure of David Ruffin. His gritty, soulful vocals defined many of the group's greatest hits, including "Runaway Child," "I Can't Get Next to You," "Psychedelic Shack," "Ball of Confusion," "Papa Was a Rollin' Stone," "A Song for You," "Shakey Ground," "Just My Imagination," and Motown's first Grammy Award winner, "Cloud Nine."

The Temptations were inducted into the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame in 1989. Members Eddie Kendricks, David Ruffin, Dennis Edwards, Paul Williams, Melvin Franklin, and Otis Williams earned five Grammy Awards, including the Lifetime Achievement Award in 2013. The group has charted 53 Billboard hits and released 16 Platinum albums, cementing their place as one of music's most enduring acts.

Rolling Stone Magazine ranked The Temptations among the 100 Greatest Artists of All Time, and the Library of Congress National Recording Registry preserved "My Girl," "Papa Was a Rollin' Stone," and "Ain't Too Proud to Beg" as American musical treasures.

After his time with The Temptations, Dennis Edwards launched a successful solo career with his hit "Don't Look Any Further" (1984), which remains a popular sample in Hip-Hop and R&B today. In 1990, Edwards reunited with Ruffin and Kendricks before forming his own group, The Temptations Review Featuring Dennis Edwards, in 1997. He led the group until his passing in 2018.

Today, the legacy continues under the direction of David Sea, who previously performed with Kendricks, Ruffin & Edwards. Longtime members Mike Pattillo, Chris Arnold, and Bernard Gibson—all personally chosen by Edwards—along with newest member Eddie Cameron, carry on the unmistakable Temptations sound that defined generations.
